# 2. Project proposal (summary):

Fighting corruption requires joint action by business, government and civil society. Chambers and entrepreneurs are key players in corruption prevention through collective action. The project is a scaling up of the previous sequa-SII project 'Fair Markets', now focussing on more Siemens relevant geographical areas and business sectors in China.

**2. Key objective of the project:** (describe what the project is setting out to achieve, the target group and beneficiaries of the project)

The project focusses on capacity building of Chambers and entrepreneurs to support the establishment of compliance systems in China's private sector. Whereas Chinese Chambers (target group) are strengthened as facilitators, private companies are the

beneficiaries. The project concentrates on exporters and suppliers of international companies.

3. Key activities planned: (describe the key activities that you will undertake to achieve the outlined objectives of the project including an estimated timeline) (maximum 2,500 characters)

The project will cover a period of three years and include the following activities:

- Organization of kick-off conferences and training workshops with entrepreneurs at the site of each local partner (kick-off: year 1, months 2-3, 2 follow-up workshops)
- 2. Training of compliance officers and within participating companies chamber staff in anti-corruption issues and compliance standards (year 1-3)
- 3. Development of training and consulting material for entrepreneurs (year 1-2) based on the already distributed learning tools: Handbooks and case studies, e-learning tool Compliance Officer", check lists, UN learning DVD, etc. New tools could be provided to companies which are simple and innovative at the same time:
  - A daily compliance question sent by intranet email from company server to each employee administered by HR department. This tool needs a data base with 250 questions. The advantage of this tool is a daily reminder which no training workshop can provide.
  - An update of the e-learning tool "Compliance officer". The existing version 1.0 had 22 case studies and questions, but mainly related to tendering and public procurement. New version 2 could offer new cases and questions with different focus (e.g. private sector private sector corruption).
- 4. Support to entrepreneurs to set up necessary organisational structures to deal with compliance (e.g. Code of Conduct, compliance officer / help desk, contract templates, structures, processes, reporting) (year 1)
- 5. Integrity round tables in "Compliance Industry Club" (twice a year at the location of the BMO partner).
- 6. Implementation of information events and training programmes on compliance standards and anti-corruption regulations for enterprises and government authorities implemented or facilitated by partner BMOs (years 1-3). Intense cooperation with German BME to promote their Code of Conduct during BME procurement trade fairs.
- 7. Organization of competitions led by BMOs to identify national best practices of anti-corruption programmes and compliance standards and create incentives for enterprises to implement these policies. For example, BME offers to list Chinese suppliers with Code of Conduct on the official BME "accepted suppliers" website. (Year 3)
- 8. Public relations tools (e.g. website, information brochures, newsletter, press articles, anti-corruption exhibition) to accompany project activities in order to raise public awareness (years 1-3) for anti-corruption issues

- 9. Visiting and networking programmes to promote exchange of experience and best practices in China (years 2-3)
- 10. Final Conference Outreach and communication activities for project results by promoting best practice examples, e.g. of public "Compliance Award Ceremony" event. 10 companies receive an award after three years at the end of the project presented by the German Confederation of Small Business and Crafts. This will be highly appreciated by the companies because of the brand effect and shall motivate them to engage (year 3).
- 11. Evaluation and documentation of approaches applied, good practices created, and follow-up required.
- 12. Based on the evaluation, organisation of a final conference with participants from all partners to ensure exchange of experiences and good practices (year 3, end of project)

  The above-listed activities will finally lead to the following key results:

### Result 1:

Regular public-private dialogue platforms on anti-corruption and compliance standards in the partner country established and functioning

# Output/Milestones:

Compliance roundtables on anti-corruption and compliance standards are established and functioning (Shanghai, Jiangsu, Jiangsi)

Output/Milestones:

- 1 platform meeting has taken place in Jiangsu, Jiangxi and Shanghai (starting year 1, months 3-4 until the end of project). After initial trainings of enterprises, the platform meetings will be arranged in the new setting of the "Compliance Industry Club", a round table forum organized by each local chamber every 6 months.
- Main results of all platform meetings have been documented and disseminated (ongoing)
- In total 3 public private dialogue conferences have taken place (year 2-3)
- Final public private conference hosted by ACFC

### Result 2:

Industry-specific standards on anti-corruption and compliance have been developed for selected sectors and are being applied by companies.

### Output/Milestones:

- Good practices from other countries, including Germany and Europe have been transferred (drawing on sequa's gGmbH experience, as well as good practices development within its network) (year 1, months 6-12).

- The BME Code of Conduct or equivalent CoC has been agreed upon by companies involved (years 1-2). A minimum of 200 companies have committed themselves to apply these voluntary standards (end of project).
- Information on compliance standards and anti-corruption measures has been disseminated to a total of 10.000 companies.

### Result 3:

Support mechanisms are provided to enterprises for the incorporation of anti-corruption and compliance standards.

### Output/Milestones:

- The partner Chambers are participating in an annual planning workshop with sequa to discuss and detail annual activities and time schedules.
- A steering committee is set up and monitors the project's approach and progress.
- A road map for collective action has been developed and agreed upon, and is implemented by each platform (starting end of year 1, to be updated each year)
- In each enterprise participating in the 'Compliance Industry Club' at least 3 staff have been trained as compliance and anti-corruption experts (year 1-2) and the companies have implemented an organisational structure to deal with issues of compliance and collective action, e.g. a compliance officer to manage compliance policy within the enterprise, a help desk, anti-corruption/compliance committee (year 1-2).
- Training / Consultancy material, knowledge data base has been developed and can be used by experts (year 1)
- 4 events (conferences, workshops, visiting programmes) promoting exchange of know-how and experience events for enterprises have been implemented (Year1-3)
- 1 award ceremony for enterprises has been carried out to promote best practice examples in the media at each provincial Chamber (years 3)
- websites promoting collective action and informing on project results have been set up and are managed by the partner Chambers (end of year 1).
- The Provincial Chambers have established Compliance Information desks which coordinate project related activities and offer services to enterprises.

The project supports private companies in introducing and applying compliance and anti-corruption programmes which improve their competitiveness and contribute to fair markets. It brings anti-corruption issues to the political agenda and supports enforcement of and compliance with regulations. Public awareness is raised.

The project will use existing expertise from the Hunan Chamber for capacity building on level playing field. Experts trained under the previous project will be trainers and multipliers for the second project. It is innovative as it uses a bottom-up approach for capacitating chambers and companies to take fulfil their role in collective action.

All partner chambers proactively contacted sequa and SIEMENS for this project. They are fully committed to engage in corruption prevention. They are long-term partners of sequa in China and organisationally and financially sustainable. The project will not result in high organisational costs which would bear risks for financial sustainability.

The project is a result of the roll-out of the first SII project sequa implemented in China. The second project will also have a strong networking component for national replication and will aim to integrate further chambers in China. Close cooperation with the Alliance for Integrity (link) will be ensured regarding scaling-up and replication.

# **Annex 2: Budgeting and Funding Rules**

The Project Budget must comply with the following rules and, if the Applicant is selected for Funding, it shall become part of the Funding Agreement as Annex to it:

#### 1.1 General Rules:

- (a) The Project Budget covers the term from Project Launch to Project End ("Funding Period") and shows budgeted costs on a yearly basis. The basis will be the Siemens fiscal year: 01 October 30 September.
- (b) All budgeting and reporting has to be done in USD.
- (c) Each Project activity must be budgeted and accounted for separately (except for personnel costs, which are summarized in one Project activity).
- (d) Budgeted and actual costs must be split between the Applicant and any Project Partner Organization involved, if any.
- (e) Budgeted and actual costs must be reasonable and economic.
- (f) Local sourcing shall be preferred over non-local sourcing.

### 1.2 Personnel Costs:

(a) All Project Core Team Members must be budgeted and accounted for under this category of costs. Project Core Team Members are e.g. full-time personnel of the Integrity Partner and/or the Project Partner Organization, if any, that are fully or partially delegated to work on the Project, or consultants specifically hired for the Project as well as administrative support by team assistants, listed in the Expression of Interest form (section 5).

- (b) The calculation of budgets for personnel costs must be based on direct personnel costs excluding overhead contributions and profit margins. Direct personnel costs means all costs directly attributable to Project Core Team Members e.g. monthly gross salaries, payroll taxes, additional payments to the employee such as performance related yearly bonuses, company born costs for contributions to social welfare, (e.g. social insurance) pension plans and other benefits and expenses for staff competency development.
- (c) Salaries for personnel must be in line with standard local rates. Salaries for local / regional personnel and international personnel must be shown per job category (e.g. Project Director, Project Manager, Project Assistant).

Budgeted and direct costs for personnel may only correspond to the respective salaries as specified in the Expression of Interest form (section 5) – "Project Core Team Members" for such personnel. If a person is only partially delegated to work on the Project, the percentage corresponding to the work time allocated to the project shall apply for budgeting and accounting of direct personnel costs as described in 1.2 (h).

# 1.3 Costs per activity:

For each Project activity the following cost categories have to be specified:

(a) Further Consultants or other subcontractors

Further consultants or subcontractors means third parties which are engaged for Project activities, as the case may be, on a short-term basis or for certain parts of the activities, and which are not listed as Project Partners in the Expression of Interest Form and are thus not part of the Project Core Team and are therefore not listed under "Personnel Costs". When assigning consultants or other subcontractors to the Project, Siemens is to be informed about such assignments and should receive the CV of such consultants and further information on the subcontractors. Third party's costs have to be listed as individual cost item in the respective Project activity;

# (b) Travel costs

Travel costs are e.g. costs for flights, accommodation and per diems for

food.

Travelling shall generally be made in economy class. Travel costs shall be reasonable.

For travel costs, the Integrity Partner may suggest lump-sums for daily allowances, accommodation and car use (US-Cent per km) related to local travel. For international travel actual costs for flights as well as per diems and accommodation allowances based on local tax regulations are required.

# (c) Other costs

Other costs shall include any other costs for Project activities apart from personnel costs and general project costs (see section 1.4) e.g. conference facilities, catering, printing, marketing or design.

Integrity Partners shall explicitly list at least three of the biggest items and all items with a cost share of more than 20% of other costs separately.

# 1.4 General project costs:

General project costs relate to the entire Project, are not linked to a specific Project activity and include for example the following items:

- (a) costs for preparation of the yearly Audit Reports by an external auditor acceptable to Siemens
- (b) costs for travelling to a Siemens Integrity Initiative Conference in Europe, if organized,

A budgetary provision for the costs associated with economy travel of one person including two overnight stays is to be made.

# (c) costs for End of Project Evaluation

- (i) Funding Amount lower or equal to 500,000 USD: 5,000 USD shall be foreseen in the last Year of the Project Budget,
- (ii) Funding Amount higher than 500,000 USD: 1% of total Project activity costs shall be foreseen in the last Year of the Project Budget

### (d) further general internal costs

e.g. costs for bookkeeping and financial transactions, preparation of bi-annual reports and a final report, office costs (e.g. rent, phone costs, office equipment) which are directly related to or in proportion to the Project activities, other internal transfer costs not explicitly mentioned above.

Such general internal costs shall be budgeted by using a flat amount of 10% of the total Project activity costs. No additional general internal costs will be reimbursed.

# 1.5 Inflation and Exchange Rate Effects:

Any budgeted costs shall reflect inflation as well as currency exchange rate effects for the Funding Period. A retrospective reimbursement of such cost effects is not subject to Funding.

# 1.6 Other Sponsors:

Any other financial support (e.g. funding) or free of charge support that the Integrity Partner or any Project Partner Organization receives for the Project or for "similar or identical" Project activities must be listed and named, if already known, in the Project Budget and deducted from the total project costs in order to achieve the total Funding Amount applied for under the Siemens Integrity Initiative.

#### 1.7 Taxes:

All cost items mentioned in this Annex 2 must be shown net (i.e. before any taxes or other costs). Taxes for which the Integrity Partner or as the case may be the Project Partner Organizations are eligible for tax refund may not be included in the Project Budget.

Any other taxes for which the Integrity Partner or as the case may be the Project Partner Organizations are not eligible for tax refund must be shown and explained separately in the Project Budget.

### **Annex 3: Project Budget**

For a complete set of documents the Expression of Interest (EOI) form (word document) needs to be jointly submitted with Annex 3 Project Budget (excel-sheet) and all the required information and supporting documentation listed in Annex 1.
